Public Examinations Summer 2006

At Advanced Level, St John's once again achieved the near 100% pass rate which has now become the norm, whilst also increasing the proportion of higher grades and so the average points tally for each student. 49% of all results were at A and B grades, and 77% at A-C. These excellent results meant that students secured the university places of their choice - and also that the College moved firmly into the upper reaches of national tables.
